

As Julie and Paul have been out of the country, we have had the privilege of receiving sermons from several of our ordained ministers. We are most fortunate to have many ministers and chaplains as members of our congregation. I am expressly grateful to Thelma Flowers, Steve Tate, and Pat Boswell for providing our congregation with powerful and tender, thought-provoking Scripture-based messages these last few weeks. While I imagine not the intention, these ministers provided us an opportunity to experience what is possible for our future.
